Social Institutions



Society: collection of *interdependent* people: share a common goal most basic level, **survival**. (Remember: *we are social creatures*.)

Fundamental task of any society is to survive as a collectivity.

What do we need for a society to survive?

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Think-Pair-Share

Basic Survival Needs of a Society

Produce and distribute goods and services necessary for survival.

Replace those that die (bring new people into the society - we are not immortal).

Care for people who cannot take care of themselves.

Train people to produce the goods and services necessary for survival.

Establish rules (laws) and rewards and punishments to ensure cooperation.


Provide answers to philosophical and ethical questions, to *provide motivation* to live together harmoniously.

Society organizes the accomplishment of these activities.

This organization of society is what we call social institutions:

a widely agreed upon (understood) set of practices that a group of people develops in order to live together that <u>gets something done that needs to be done for social</u> <u>survival.</u>

(it's what a society DOES to survive)



Social institutions are the building blocks of society.

Societal Needs

Produce and distribute goods and services necessary for survival.


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Additional interesting ideas about social institutions & practices:

•Societal institutions persist over time, yet are dynamic: institutions are always changing.

•Include rules for sanctioning people who don't follow the practices,

•Constrain some people and offer opportunities to others (they impact people's lives in different ways),

• Disagreement among members of the group about the practices,

•Institutions can create and maintain inequality.

And finally,

Institutions are interdependent:

That is, changes in one institution can and usually will create changes in other institutions.






